Questions: With the additional funding, what will the purpose of the new teacher hire? Tim- same as last year. We will have the new teacher take over P.E. class. This will free up the teachers to work with those students who may need additional help.

Question: How often will those students needing extra help be pulled from PE? Tim-They might miss a class or two depending on the situation. The goal is to get several kids together that need additional assistance on a similar topic.

Question: What are people thinking about school photos and the company that takes them? Tim-There are some issues that parents are having including price, quality ect. Please let us know how you feel good or bad so that we can take this information to the photography company.

Question: What are you thinking could be done with the unclaimed lost and found? Tim-People seem to enjoy thrifting. Maybe there is something we could do around setting up a thrift shop a couple time a year with the lost and found to support those families that may need some assistance or could use a sweater or jacket at a reduced price.

Question: With the results showing that the grade 4, 5 and 6 had lower levels of comprehension versus the students in K-3 (2023), can we assume that COVID interruption could account for some of those challenges? Tim- It is hard to tease out the exact reason why the higher grades score lower. However, with those students in k-2 during that period, you could see a potential correlation. K-2 is where they learn the bases for writing and reading.

Question: Has the class size increase have anything to do with why the students are reporting a decrease in (Alberta Education Accountability Measures Reports) student

engagement. Tim- There was a reduction in staff (PE teacher being released) to help keep the class sizes down. The school has done it's best to keep classes at a reasonable size.

Question: Do we get additional money for those students who have IPP? Tim- There are many factors that are considered. The number of students has very little impact.

Question: What does the "at risk" mean? Tim- It means that the students are at risk of not hitting grade level.

Question: Are you planning another coffee with the Principal in December so that Parents who have concerns or questions about the SIIR? Tim- Yes, I don't have an exact date.

Question: How are you handling the fees that remain owed? Tim- we forgive. There are programs that we can look at for subsidies/funding for school fees that could help those who need it. There is also some funding through council that can be considered on a case by case.

Question: Nothing is really discussed about Staff well being. Is there something that you feel we could support in that way? Tim- teachers have started wearing Red shirts on Fridays in support of public education.

Question: In respect to the fees, they sometimes take a while to posted and you forget. Is there a way to get notifications when the fees are there? Tim- We can manually send emails when fees are posted.

There was a discussion about portables and not enough room to put the new students in. Over the next 3 years they have funding for 30 new schools across Alberta. Key take away is to make sure that we have Charlen May attend a council meeting and bring forth a structured agenda as to our concerns. It was interesting to learn that schools that are at capacity have more dollars going to the students versus those that have a dropping population. Schools like ours, more money goes to maintenance and facility fees to heat and run a school that is not as largely populated.
